SPEAKING & WRITING EMPHASIS COURSES FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

- ❖ Transfer students with 30-60 transfer credits need 2 courses of both speaking and writing emphasis - 1 must be at the 300/400 level.
- ❖ Those with 61-90 need 1 speaking and 1 writing emphasis at the 300/400 level.
- ❖ Those with 90+ credits are exempt from both.
- ❖ Academic Passport waives speaking emphasis altogether but not writing emphasis.

XI. FREE ELECTIVES

Take enough free electives to complete **120 credits**. College preparatory courses (e.g., MATQ20, MATQ30) do NOT count towards graduation. The actual number of free electives required will vary for each student.

Repeat Policy: Please note that WCU allows students a total of 6 maximum repeats for their entire undergraduate career. A course may be repeated a maximum of 2 times only! The most recent grade, regardless of whether it is higher or lower, will be the grade used for the GPA calculation. Courses taken at WCU **CANNOT** be repeated at an external institution! Remedial Q courses can be repeated up to three times. Failure to receive the appropriate passing grade will result in dismissal from WCU.

Academic Probation: Students are placed on Academic Probation if their cumulative GPA falls below 2.0. Students will have 1 academic semester to regain good standing and will be required to create an Academic Recovery Plan (ARP) with their advisors.
